Hearts of Surfing is 100 percent volunteer driven and has grown significantly since its inception in 2014. It has been featured on NBC, ABC and FOX news, the Dr. Oz Show, The Press of Atlantic City, The Current, The Sentinel and NJ.com. Hearts of Surfing was awarded the Donald J Sykes award in 2014 and the Best Nonprofit Award by the City of Ocean City in 2021.

Cindy raised three children. Her oldest son, James Robert ("Jamie"), had significant challenges, including autism. Cindy advocated wholeheartedly for her son and for other families touched by autism. Jamie passed suddenly in March of 2020 and by June of that year Cindy and her husband, Bob presented the first annual Jamie Fertsch Memorial Scholarship to a graduating high school senior.

Cindy is passionate about her family, community and dogs. When she is not working, you can usually find her in the park or on dog beach with her golden retriever and lab mix dogs.
